### **Technology Fund**

Following the October 2021 Consent Decree Action Plan, a \$2 million Technology Fund was created. This one-time Technology Fund is intended for individuals to purchase hardware or software that will assist, improve, increase and/or maintain their ability to meet the outcomes of their Individual Support Plan (ISP) goals, and will facilitate participation in employment and integrated community activities.

A library of information will soon be added to the website, including accessible apps for travel, safety, work, and learning; training tools for individuals, families, and provider agencies; and other helpful technology resources.

#### **Request Process**

- 1. Before making a request for funding, research what technology you might be interested in and how it could benefit you.
- 2. Complete the request form to request a purchase through the Technology Fund.
  - a. The form is available in English or Spanish. Select your language in the first question.
  - b. Please remember that the technology request needs to align with one or more goals in your ISP.
  - c. The request form may be submitted online or sent to your social caseworker. If the form is submitted online, once completed a window will open with a confirmation message thanking you for the submission.
- 3. A Tech Review Committee will review requests on a quarterly basis. The first review will occur in June 2022. Applicants will be notified of the determination shortly after.

#### **Research Project**

The Paul V. Sherlock Center on Disabilities at Rhode Island College will engage in a research project on use of the Technology Fund in order to understand individuals' experiences with their purchased technology. This will help the State to think about how to address technology needs and supports in the future.

The next Tech Fund Informational Forum will be hosted in July 2022

- Non-Emergency Medical (NEMT) and Elderly Transportation Program (ETP), which are currently provided by MTM
- Local Van Services provided by Cities and Towns
- Rhode Island's Commuter Rail and Train Service

The information you provide will help the Coordinating Council better understand how publicly-funded transportation services meet the needs of ALL Rhode Islanders and identify areas for improvement in our state.

### **About the Human Services Transportation Coordinating Council**

The Coordinating Council is charged with better integrating and improving transportation programs that support individuals in need of specialized transportation assistance. It was created by the Rhode Island General Assembly in RI Gen. Laws § 39-18.1-5, which established a coordinating council consisting of state agencies responsible for meeting the needs of low-income seniors and persons with disabilities.

The following agencies are currently represented on the Council: RI Dept. of Behavioral Health, Developmental Disabilities and Hospitals (BHDDH); RI Dept. of Health (RIDOH); RI Dept. of Human Services (DHS); RI Division of Statewide Planning; RI Executive Office of Health & Human Services (EOHHS); RI Office of Healthy Aging (OHA); RI Office of Rehabilitative Services (ORS); RI Office of Veterans Services; RI Public Transit Authority (RIPTA); and RI Dept. of Transportation (RIDOT).

This helps DD to inform the State budgeting process of the particular needs of DD participants and keep them up-to-date on what is happening in the Division.

### The COVID Public Health Emergency Has Been Extended

On Wednesday, April 13, 2022, the Biden administration renewed the COVID-19 public health emergency (PHE) for another 90 days. This will extend pandemic policies and flexibilities that the Division has put in place. States will have 60 days notice before the PHE ends.

BHDDH continues to work in collaboration with the RI Medicaid office and the Federal Center for Medicare and Medicaid (CMS) to make some of the flexibilities during COVID permanent, including the ability for self-directed participants to hire family and guardians and telehealth.

The CDC has approved a 2<sup>nd</sup> COVID-19 booster for anyone over age 50. Do you need help getting information or scheduling an appointment for a vaccination or booster?



We can help you get the information you need to decide when, how and where to get a vaccination or booster.

We can help you arrange an appointment at a pharmacy, clinic or drive thru site to get your vaccination or booster. If going to one of these sites is very difficult for you, it is possible to arrange to be vaccinated in the comfort of your home.

### Research Study of New HCBS Outcome Measures Launched Participants with Disabilities Needed!

Getting services at home or in the community is important for people with disabilities. To make those services better, we need to know if and how the services are working. We are testing measures that include questions about how well Home and Community-Based Services (HCBS) are helping people live the lives they want. We need your help to make sure the measures provide valuable information.

The Research and Training Center on HCBS Outcome Measurement (RTC/OM) at the <u>Institute on Community Integration</u> has developed measures that include questions about how well Home and Community-Based Services (HCBS) are helping people with a variety of disabilities live the lives they want.

In this research study, interviewers will meet over videoconference (Zoom) with people with disabilities, or in person, to ask questions about their services and important areas of their lives (e.g., social connectedness; meaningful activities). Each person taking part will be interviewed at three separate times over a year. Everyone interviewed will receive a gift card.

RTC/OM is recruiting participants for interviews right now! In order to participate, you must:

- Be 18 years of age or older.
- Have a disability and receive services or supports due to your disability.
- Provide consent for participation in the research study (or guardian consents).
- Be willing to take part in a 60-90 minute interview.

ICI is also recruiting research study participants who know someone with a disability. In this part of the research study, we will meet over video conference to talk with you and ask questions about the experiences of someone you know with a disability to determine how well you believe you can answer questions about that person. We may record the interview.

To take part, you must:

- Be at least 18 years old.
- Know someone well who has a disability and receives services or supports for the disability (Physical, Mental health, Intellectual and developmental, Age-related, or Acquired Brain injury/TBI)
- Provide consent.
- Be willing to take part in a 60-90 minute interview(s).

Everyone we interview will get a gift card per interview.
