Spending time in the community doing things you enjoy can boost your mood. Yet, transportation can be a barrier. **Barriers** are things that get in the way of achieving something. There are many transportation barriers, like not having a car to drive or living far away from a bus stop.

The Rhode Island Public Transit Authority (RIPTA) is a local resource that will help you get where you want to go. One RIPTA program for people with disabilities to explore is the <u>RIde Program (webpage</u>). This program offers door to door transportation services to people unable to use fixed-route buses. 
